Fulbright Science and Technology scholarship

Deadlines: Express interest to Embassy by May 2, 2011

Submit completed application and all documents by June, 15, 2011

The U.S. Embassy's Public Affairs Section in Barbados administers the Fulbright Science and Technology Student. This is a world-wide scholarship and is open to citizens of Antigua/Barbuda, Barbados, Dominica, Grenada, St Kitts/Nevis, St. Lucia, and St. Vincent and the Grenadines who live in one of these islands. The scholarship funds doctoral study in science, technology and engineering at top U.S. universities. The candidates from this Embassy compete with a world wide pool of applicants. The Fulbright Science and Technology scholarship is designed to be among the most prestigious international scholarships in science and technology.

Fulbright Faculty Development Scholarship

Deadline: TBD, Early May

The U.S. Embassy's Public Affairs Section in Barbados administers the Fulbright Faculty Development scholarship. Applicants must be citizens of and live in one of the islands to which the Embassy at Bridgetown is accredited (Antigua/Barbuda, Barbados, Dominica, Grenada, St. Kitts/Nevis, St. Lucia and St. Vincent and the Grenadines).

Applicants must teach and must plan to continue teaching at the college or university level. Applicants must be nominated by the college or university at which they teach. The scholarship provides two years of funding for master's or doctoral degrees at U.S. universities. Two scholarships are awarded each year.

Fulbright Foreign Student Scholarship

Deadline: July 15 (offered annually)

The U.S. Embassy's Public Affairs Section in Barbados administers the Fulbright Foreign Student scholarship. Applicants must be citizens of and live in one of the islands to which the Embassy at Bridgetown is accredited (Antigua/Barbuda, Barbados, Dominica, Grenada, St. Kitts/Nevis, St. Lucia and St. Vincent and the Grenadines). The scholarship provides two years of funding for master's or doctoral degrees at U.S. universities. Three scholarships are awarded each year.

Hubert Humphrey scholarship

Deadline: TBD, Mid-September

The scholarship, named after the late American Vice-President Hubert H. Humphrey, allows Eastern Caribbean professionals and administrators an opportunity to spend one year at an American university to enhance their professional competence. The Humphrey scholarship program brings accomplished mid-career professionals from developing countries to the United States for study and related practical professional experiences. Scholarships are granted competitively to professional candidates with a commitment to public service in both the public and private sectors. An additional substance abuse component in the field of public health policy and management emphasizes drug education, treatment, and prevention. Candidates from the Eastern Caribbean compete with candidates from other developing countries. Applicants must be citizens of and live in one of the islands to which the Embassy at Bridgetown is accredited (Antigua/Barbuda, Barbados, Dominica, Grenada, St. Kitts/Nevis, St. Lucia and St. Vincent and the Grenadines). Fulbright Visiting Researchers Scholarship

Deadline: TBD, Early October

College and university faculty and professionals are eligible to apply for this scholarship. Applicants must have at least a master's degree. The scholarship provides a one time grant of \$10,000 USD and an air ticket to go to the U.S. and back. Applicants may remain in the U.S. for a minimum of two months and a maximum of three months in order to conduct research or engage in a training program. Applicants must be citizens of and live in one of the islands to which the Embassy at Bridgetown is accredited (Antigua/Barbuda, Barbados, Dominica, Grenada, St. Kitts/Nevis, St. Lucia and St. Vincent and the Grenadines). Deadline: TBD, generally November 1

Program dates: The Study of the United States Institutes for Secondary School Educators will take place over the course of six weeks beginning in mid June 2011. The Study of the United States Institutes for Secondary School Educators will provide two multinational groups of 30 secondary educators each (classroom teachers, teacher trainers, curriculum developers, textbook writers, ministry of education officials, etc.) with a deeper understanding of U.S. society, education, and culture, past and present.

Fulbright NEXUS scholarship

Deadline: TBD, generally November 1

The Office of Public Diplomacy of the U.S. Embassy at Bridgetown, Barbados is pleased to announce a NEW Fulbright program. The Fulbright Nexus program will link faculty, applied researchers and practitioners across the Western Hemisphere and the United States through international exchanges and seminars. Participants will spend up to one calendar year engaged in collaborative thinking, analysis, problem-solving and multi-disciplinary project-oriented research in one of three broad, inter-related areas: Science, technology and innovation; Entrepreneurship; and Sustainable energy.

The Fulbright NEXUS program will begin in May 2011 and end in April 2012.

ELIGIBILITY: It is preferred but not required that Fulbright Nexus applicants have a Ph.D. or equivalent professional/terminal degree. Candidates with a master's degree are required to have a minimum of five years research experience. Preference will be given to early or mid-career academics, applied researchers and/or practitioners with research experience in the public, non-profit, or private sector. Preference will be given to applicants without recent U.S. experience.

Fulbright U.S. Scholar Program – offered annually

This scholarship program brings experienced U.S. College Faculty to teach and or to conduct research at Colleges and Universities in the Eastern Caribbean for a semester, or for an academic year. The scholarship program pays for the following for the American scholar, travel and relocation, monthly maintenance, monthly stipend and books. The local institution is expected to provide students, classroom and office space and administrative support. It is also helpful if you can offer the scholar some assistance in finding appropriate housing.
